Applications are accepted as early as freshman year and at any time up to May 1 of junior year. At that time, an applicant should be prepared to show that they have completed enough academic requirements, or have requested enough courses to meet the minimum course requirements.

All applications are subject to the approval of a department chair (or STEM coordinator) and the Academic Dean. *Department chairs can only approve plans that are connected to their departments.*

Distinguished Graduate candidates must meet at least 3 times with their faculty advisor. This includes at least once in their senior year by October 1. Department chairs will set timelines for completion of all work.

A finished project is due by the end of the first quarter of your senior year. The Distinguished Graduate showcase is in mid-November. Your medal will be awarded to you at Class Night in June of your senior year.
