Program Description

The John Bapst Scholars Program is ideal for students who live a long distance from school. Dormitory living itself can be a great way for students to practice independence and self-reliance as a way of preparing for college. The program offers a shared dormitory room in a John Bapst residence hall, beginning with boarding orientation in August and ending with exams in June. Dorm rooms are either doubles or triples. In addition to private tuition (if applicable) and fees, a food charge of \$1,500 per semester (\$3,000 for the year) is charged to families. John Bapst Scholars are generally in residence five nights per week while school is in session. They may serve as student leaders and ambassadors in the international boarding program. They and their families are encouraged to invite international students home from time to time.

Application Criteria

Students who wish to apply should meet the following criteria:

- be in good academic standing at John Bapst or their current school;
- be in good standing with a record of good citizenship;
- interview with Head of School.
